## Race 6 RAYNER BUILDING 3YO

MR CONDUCTOR (N Teeluck) hung throughout the race and shifted out under pressure near the 200 metres momentarily hampering MENDIP (V Colgan).
When questioned regarding the performance of ALCADESSA, R Myers could offer no excuses. Trainer T Bambry reported the filly may have been hit in the eye by a clod during the running.

## Race 7 MIDWEST DISPOSALS HANDICAP

D Bradley the rider of GYPSY FAIR viewed footage of the home straight after JUSTLIKEYASISTER (L Allpress) shifted out near the 200 metres when only marginally clear of GYPSY FAIR )which had to change ground inwards to continue to improve. After viewing coverage, connections elected not to proceed with an objection.
Prior to the authorisation of dividends, stewards requested a ruling from the JCA under the provision of Rule 632 into whether SLIMLINE obtained a fair start after the mare became fractious immediately prior to the gates opening and then got its head over the side of the barrier stall. Trainer G Vile, after viewing footage, conceded that SLIMLINE did receive a fair start and the JCA confirmed that opinion declaring SLIMLINE a starter. Stewards advised connections SLIMLINE must barrier trial before next racing.
R Hannam advised that OUR GAZZA was disappointing and he could offer no excuses.

## Race 8 RANGITIKEI TYRE CENTRE LTD HANDICAP

Trainer J Lynds advised stewards that DE GAULLE was found to be sore at his stable and requested the horse be scratched. Stewards scratched the gelding at 2.55 pm . J Lynds was advised a veterinary certificate is required and a vet clearance provided, prior to the gelding's next start.
ROD'S LINCOLN (D Bradley) and CARNABY (R Myers) were slow away.
T Johnson the rider of PLATINUM COMMAND was warned for the manner in which he used his whip over the final stages
of the event.
Connections advised that CARNABY was not suited by the track conditions preferring a looser more rain affected surface.
