Race 1	WATERFORCE/MARSH INSURANCE BROKERS 3YO MAIDEN
ISLAND DREAM (C Johnson) – wide throughout. TECHNICIAN (D Bradley) – inclined to shift out under pressure in the home straight. MIDNIGHT DELIGHT (D Bradley) – inclined to shift out under pressure in the home straight. DUTROW (T Johnson) – monetarily held up near the 400 prior to being angled out in the home straight.	
Race 2	JOHN TURKINGTON FORESTRY / MANAWATU TOYOTA HANDICAP
AL MUNROE (T Johnson) – slow away and settled back. Raced wide without cover in the early and middle stages KING OF ROCK (E Farr) – slow away and settled back. WINDERMERE LAD (D Hirini) – stumbled in its initial stride from the barrier HAMILTONIAN (M Singh) - three wide early, taken forward near the 1400 metres. SEA CRUSIER (J Parkes) – under pressure early and dropped out. Rider advised the gelding did not handle the going. A post-race veterinary examination was clear. FAZED (H Tinsley) - Under pressure early and dropped out. Rider advised the gelding was never travelling in the going.	
Race 3	AGRICOM / H&T AGRONOMICS HANDICAP

<p>OUR GAZZA (J Parkes) – began awkwardly and settled back.</p> <p>CARTAGENA (R Goldsbury) – slow to begin.</p> <p>ANOTHERCHANCETAKEN (Te Baker) - lugged rounding the turn into the back straight.</p> <p>R GOLDSBURY – reminded of her whip use on a runner out of contention.</p>	
Race 4	PILET CONTRACTING / PIONEER SEEDS HANDICAP
<p>PHILIPA CHARLOTTE (Z Moki) – began awkwardly</p> <p>PLEASURE PALACE (A Chan) - was tightened at the start</p> <p>A RED PRINCE (J Parkes) – had to be steadied for some distance when racing up onto the heels of THE LAIRDS LADY in back straight. Continued to over-race for some distance.</p> <p>THE LAIRDS LADY (R Goldsbury) – under pressure early in home straight and dropped out. A post-race veterinary inspection revealed nothing amiss.</p> <p>BEADLE (N Teeluck) – held up rounding the turn and into the home straight finding clear running near the 250 metres after angling wider on the track.</p> <p>GOBSTOPPER (T Johnson) – rider reported that after being slow away, the gelding was outpaced in the early and middle stages but did run on fairly in home straight.</p>	
Race 5	NUFARM / FPANZ HANDICAP
<p>MCCULLUM (Z Nor Asman) – raced three-wide without cover around the final turn and into the home straight. Shifted in under pressure early in the home straight and was quickly straightened. Z Nor Asman advised the gelding was never comfortable in the heavy 11 going. Veterinary inspection clear.</p> <p>MASTER PLATINUM (T Johnson) - held up and changed ground inwards near 200 metres but was again held up and did not secure clear running until close to the finishing line</p> <p>TALK THE TORQUE (D Bradley) – jumped sideways at the start, lost ground and settled back.</p> <p>BANNOCKBURN (J Parkes) – slow away. Rider attributed the improved performance from previous start to preferring the heavy 11 track.</p> <p>WHATWEDO (E Farr) – over raced in the early and middle stages.</p> <p>LAST CHANCE (L Hemi) – returned to the enclosure with blood present in a nostril. Veterinary inspection revealed the mare should be classed a bleeder and now subject to the mandatory stand down period of three months. Veterinary clearance required before next racing.</p>	
Race 6	CP WOOL & CARRFIELDS LIVESTOCK HANDICAP
<p>FARCE (D Hirini) – raced wide early in search of better footing. Rider questioned over apparent lack of vigour in the home straight. D Hirini reported that the gelding had hung throughout and she considered there may have been something amiss so did not ride the gelding out to any extent in the final straight. A post-race veterinary examination of FARCE was clear. Trainer P McKenzie was asked to report the progress of FARCE over coming days. P McKenzie advised that FARCE would now be spelled.</p> <p>OLLIE'S NOTE (R Goldsbury) – disappointed. Not comfortable in the Heavy 11 .</p> <p>LINCOLN BAY (D Bradley) – Held up briefly approaching home straight. Rider reported gelding unsuited to the heavy going underfoot.</p>	
Race 7	MERIAL ANCARE METRIC MILE - GpIII
<p>THORN PRINCE (J Parkes) – slow away</p>	

DRAGON BEAUTY (N Teeluck) – slow away

NEW YORK MINUTE (T Mosely) - had to be steadied when over-racing near the crossing near the 1400 metres. Shifted in abruptly when struck with whip near the 200 metres momentarily hampering **MADONNA MIA** prior to being straightened.

MERITAGGIO (R Myers) - raced keenly early.

MADONNA MIA (D Bradley) - bumped with **DRAGON BEAUTY** near 800 metres when seeking a run.

KINDALEICA (G Grylls) – under pressure prior to the turn and dropped out. Veterinary examination revealed no abnormalities.

Race 8

C R GRACE LTD HANDICAP

BLAZING OPAL (C Johnson) - slow away from wide draw

WAZUZU (T Johnson) – slow away from wide draw. Had to steady at the end of the back straight when racing in restricted room prior to being angled inwards to improve. Held up near the 200 metres gaining clear running near the 150 metres bumping with **VERACIOUS (R Goldsbury)** near the 100 metres.

SARABI (J Parkes) over-raced early.

ACUTELYGOLD (D Bradley) – raced wide near end of back straight in search of better footing.

GOLDEN PENNY (B Hutton) – rider reported unsuited by the Heavy 11.

E Farr – reminded of her obligations regarding her whip use on a runner (**FORTUNE KEPT**) out of contention.
