Wairarapa Racing Club – 6 October 2016
Race 5 - THE TIN HUT
Connections of MARGOT reported that subsequent to its last, race the mare underwent an endoscopic examination which revealed a virus. MARGOT will be given the necessary time to recover.
Connections of TAIPA TIGER reported the gelding had a minor operation since last racing to correct a wind affliction and has since trialed satisfactorily.

RACE COMMENTS:

Race 1	AWAPAI FARMS 1400 (1400 metres)
ALL IN LUCK (H Andrew) - blundered in its initial stride out of the barrier and unbalanced the rider.	
A RED PRINCE (M Singh) - began awkwardly and settled back.	
SINGLE GIRL (S Weatherley) - jumped out at the start and hampered DURHAM.	

DURHAM (V Gatu) – steadied abruptly when racing up onto heels near the 800 metres so shifted out hampering ACUTELYGOLD which became unbalanced. V Gatu was reminded of her obligations when shifting ground. When questioned into the disappointing run of DURHAM, rider V Gatu advised the gelding was not entirely comfortable in the going underfoot but was nevertheless disappointing. A post-race veterinary examination was clear.

ACUTELYGOLD (R Hannam) – hampered and unbalanced near the 800 metres.

Following the event, track conditions upgraded to Slow (9) retrospective to Race 1.

Race 2	ROLY ELLIS MAIDEN 1400 (1400 metres)

ZEDLINA (T Johnson) – show away.

MADAME DEFARGE (A Chan) - underwent and passed a veterinary inspection at the start after making contact with the fence behind the barrier.

BATTLE CREEK (S O'Malley) - raced three wide without cover throughout.

STORMY HABIT (N Teeluck) - over-raced in the back straight, bumped near the 350 metres.

SHRIMP COCKTAIL (R Goldsbury) and **STORMY HABIT** (N Teeluck) - bumped when both runners attempted the same narrow run near the 350 metres. **STORMY HABIT** then made contact with the hind quarters of **CILLA CROSS** (L Magorrian), which was hampered. Stewards considered the incident accidental however both riders Goldsbury and Teeluck were reminded of their obligations when shifting ground.

Apprentice jockey C-M Waddell (HIGH QUALITY) was shown footage of her ride and advised that she is expected to straighten her mount sooner than she did on this occasion after allowing the gelding to shift out near the 100 metres tightening **BATTLE CREEK**, **SHRIMP COCKTAIL**, **RIP INTO GHIA** and **TIP THE DANCER**. When assessing the degree of interference stewards took into account simultaneous inward movement from **MADAME DEFARGE** (A Chan) . A Chan was advised to exercise greater care when in similar circumstances.

Race 3	BARRY BEATSON SPRINT 1100 (1100 metres)

HOSKINS (H Andrew) jumped out at the start hampering **DR WATSON** and **ETERNAL ANGEL**; lay out under pressure in the home straight and bumped with **PLATINUM VALENCE** when weakening inside the final 100 metres.

DR WATSON (D Hirini) – hampered at the start.

ETERNAL ANGEL (T Johnson) – hampered at the start.

METHANOL (N Teeluck) – raced greenly early and shifted inwards shortly after the start bumping with **ENCHANTING SECRET** which commenced to over-race.

ENCHANTING SECRET (J Parkes) – bumped shortly after the start then over-raced early.

JUMP FOR JOY (M Tanaka) - raced three wide without cover throughout.

Race 4	DAVID & ELLEN OLIVER MAIDEN 1200 (1200 metres)

WESTERN (S Weatherley) – hampered at the start and got back; hung throughout and could not be ridden out in the home straight. Warning placed. Trainer J Wheeler advised connections will re-assess the gelding's future.

MOWITZA (H Tinsley) – commenced to over-race shortly after the start and when being heavily restrained near the 1000 metres, clipped the heel of **EXPLOSIVE OCTAINE** and blundered, then when being corrected shifted in hampering

RAM SAM SAM.

RAM SAM SAM (K Smith) – hampered passing the 1000 metres.

Race 5 | **NZB INSURANCE PEARL SERIES RACE (1200 metres)**

BARE WITH (L Hemi) – slow away.

RAWINIA (M Singh) – tightened shortly after the start.

EM KAY POPS (R Goldsbury) had to change ground outwards near the 100 metres to improve.

LE GIGI (S McKay) – commenced to give ground from near the end of the back straight and finished some distance last. A subsequent veterinary inspection did not reveal any abnormality. S McKay advised LE GIGI raced greenly and would benefit with experience.

Race 6 | **PUKEMANU FARMS STAYERS 2200 (2200 metres)**

KINGIESSTAR (R Hannam) - began awkwardly and settled back.

TIFFANY'S (L Hemi) steadied passing the winning post first round when keen and again a short distance further.

SARABI (H Andrew) – three wide throughout.

JONQUIL (R Myers) – When questioned into the run of JONQUIL which disappointed, rider R Myers advised the mare got further back than intended and found it difficult to make up ground when wide over the final stages. R Myers added JONQUIL may improve with the run.

SANJARA (N Teeluck) – had to shift out near the 800 metres to avoid the rapidly tiring SHAMAL. Held up for a short distance near the 500 metres.

O'CEIRINS WHISPER (J Parkes) – when questioned rider J Parkes was of the opinion the gelding did not see out the 2200 metre distance at this stage of its preparation.

Race 7 | **THE MEAT COMPANY DANNEVIRKE MAIDEN 2100 (2100 metres)**

RAISING PENNY (R Hannam) – awkwardly away.

MARQUATEER (S Weatherley) – over-raced in the early stages when being steadied near the 2000 metre mark.

KING MAX (S O'Malley) - When questioned into the tactics employed on KING MAX, which raced very wide throughout and had little left at the finish, apprentice O'Malley advised his instructions were to lead if possible but was unable to do so from the wide draw with horses improving to his inside. O'Malley advised that his mount then tended to over-race when wide and he was unable to restrain the gelding back to find cover which was considered the preferred option.

Race 8 | **MARTY & DI'S CATERING 1600 (1600 metres)**

WELL RELATED (C-M Waddell) tightened at the start, got back and finished some distance last. Connections were advised that a warning is placed against WELL RELATED with regard to its competitiveness.

TAIPA TIGER (T Johnson) –tightened at the start and slow away.

RED FOX (S McKay) – raced wide without cover throughout.

SUSSED (A Chan) – had to be steadied and change ground when in restricted room between ZEDSATIONAL and RED FOX on the point of the home turn.

DAL LAUREON (R Goldsbury) - had to be steadied off the heels of AZRAF (M Singh) near the 200 metres when that runner shifted in when not clear. Apprentice M Singh was issued with a warning under Rule 638(1)(d) and advised he is expected to straighten his mount sooner than he did on this occasion.
