Race 1	STELLA ARTOIS 2100
<p>HIGH SPIRITS (M Tanaka) – Crowded shortly after the start having to be steadied. When questioned regarding the performance of the mare rider M Tanaka could offer no tangible excuse. A post-race veterinary examination did not reveal any abnormality.</p> <p>JUST YOU (D Bradley) - raced keenly in the early stages before having to be firmly restrained off heels near the 1650 metres and shifted out forcing CYCLONE TRACEY wider. Continued to race ungenerously through the middle stages.</p> <p>CYCLONE TRACEY (T Johnson) - forced wide near the 1650 metres.</p>	

<p>ZCASTLE (D Turner) – shifted out passing 600 metres making contact with GOLDEN BAY which was forced wider. D Turner was advised to exercise care when shifting ground.</p> <p>GOLDEN BAY (L Hemi) – Forced over extra ground passing 600 metres.</p>	
Race 2	TRINITY HILL MILE
<p>PERFECT MIX (T Johnson) – was slow away.</p> <p>LINCOLN BAY (M Tanaka) – raced keenly into the first bend.</p> <p>ALL IN LUCK (L Hemi) – made the first bend awkwardly when over-racing.</p> <p>CENTRE ATTENTION (N Teeluck) - had to steady off heels when over-racing passing the 900 metres.</p>	
Race 3	BEST TRAVEL 3YO
<p>ROLL THE GOLD (E Farr) – steadied when placed in restricted room shortly after the start. Was hampered near the 1000 metres when improving onto the heels of the crowded CHOUXPERB as a result ROLL OF GOLD had to be steadied abruptly and shifted out. Then commenced to over-race through the middle stages when racing three wide without cover. Was inclined to lay in when placed under pressure in the final straight.</p> <p>ZAVISTIC (J Fawcett) – crowded when placed in restricted room near the 1000 metres, having to be firmly restrained when improving onto the heels of DAZZLE STREET (R Hannam) which was being steadied after reaching the lead. R Hannam was reminded of his obligations with regard to easing the pace. ZAVISTIC then raced ungenerously for a distance becoming awkwardly placed on the heels of DAZZLE STREET near the 900 metres.</p> <p>AILEEN GRACE (V Gatu) - DEB (D Turner) shifted in when not sufficiently clear approaching the 1000 metres with AILEEN GRACE clipping a heel of that runner and blundering, also crowded was CHOUXPERB and ZAVISTIC. Hampered as a result was the trailing ROLL THE GOLD which had to steady abruptly. Jockey D Turner admitted a resultant breach of careless riding, after hearing submissions the Judicial Committee suspended Mr Turner’s licence to ride in races from the close of racing on 7th January up to and including 28th January (5 days). Trainer R McCarroll advised Stewards that the filly had suffered superficial abrasions to the near fore fetlock.</p> <p>CHOUXPERB (T Johnson) – hampered and crowded approaching the 1000 metres.</p>	
Race 4	PHILIP & ASHLEIGH GOOD LUCK FOR THE FUTURE 1400
<p>MY TOMMY (H Tinsley) – was slow away.</p> <p>BENNIES APPROVAL (E Farr) – raced three wide without cover throughout.</p> <p>SNOWDRIFT (R Hannam) - raced keenly in the early and middle stages.</p> <p>SHE KNOWS (K Smith) - made the turn awkwardly near the 800 metres and was inclined to lug out.</p> <p>FEROZ (V Gatu) - was inclined to shift in under pressure over the final stages.</p>	
Race 5	RUSSELL ROADS CITY OF HASTINGS CUP – FASTRACK 5K
<p>ETERNITY (D Turner) - began awkwardly losing ground.</p> <p>ADVENTADOR (H Tinsley) – lay out passing the 400 metres. Rider H Tinsley could offer no tangible excuse regarding the performance. A post-race veterinary examination did not reveal any abnormality.</p>

<p>REMINISCE (E Farr) – Began awkwardly losing ground.</p> <p>SABOTAGE (D Turner) – lay in under pressure in the final straight dictating PAKAPUNCH inwards. D turner was advised that he must straighten his mounts sooner than he did on this occasion.</p> <p>ISOLA BELLA (A Chan) – Apprentice A Chan advised stewards that the mare had failed to handle the firm nature of todays track.</p>	
Race 7	NZB INSURANCE PEARL SERIES RACE
<p>GARMENT (D Turner) – was slow to begin. When questioned regarding the performance of the mare Rider D Turner was of the opinion that GARMENT may be better suited to more rain affected footing.</p> <p>MIZ OLDFIELD ROAD (J Bassett) - was crowded shortly after the start having to be steadied.</p> <p>SWISSILICIOUS (V Gatu) – held up over the concluding stages when improving onto heels.</p> <p>SUO LIN NANG (D Bradley) – steadied when placed in restricted room inside the final 50 metres.</p>	
Race 8	ROGER RUSSELL & CHARLIE KEENAN MEMORIAL
<p>BELLA MARGARITA (D Turner) - was slow away.</p> <p>MOSS JAZZ (R Hannam) – began awkwardly losing ground settling at the rear of the field. Rider R Hannam was questioned into his riding over the final stages where he appeared to relax his ride. R Hannam’s explanation that he had been passed prior to relaxing his ride was accepted however he was advised that he should ride his mount out fully to the finish when circumstances permit in a manner which does not leave himself open to query.</p> <p>PENANCE (T Johnson) – was slow to begin.</p> <p>BOB’S THEJOB (M Tanaka) - over-raced in the early and middle stages.</p> <p>BRAT PACK (E Farr) – over-raced in the early stages before being allowed to improve forward to sit outside the leader near the 900 metres.</p> <p>WOODEN RED (V Gatu) – Trainer C Wood attributed the improved performance to the gelding having blinkers on for the first time.</p>
