EM KAY POP	S (T Johnson) – began awkwardly

DEEDEE'S BELT - (J Parkes) – hung out throughout with rider reporting the mare did not hit out on the firmer ground. A post-race veterinary examination revealed no abnormality.

ALL IN GLAMOUR - (D Turner) hung off the track between the 800 and 600 metres.

GUY FOX -(S MacNab) was tightened at the point of the home turn when PINSONELLA rolled out resulting in GUY FOX jostling with LOOKHERPAL for several strides. GUY FOX then commenced to shift out under pressure over the final

stages.

GO TO MAN - when questioned into the disappointing run rider H Tinsley could offer no excuse.

Race 3 WAIRARAPA TIMES AGE R75 1400M

PASS IT ON (T Johnson) - lay out entering the final straight and continued to do so for the remainder of the race.

Race 4 PUKEMANU BAR & EATERY MAIDEN 1000M

JESSICOVA (L Hemi) – tightened at the start and settled back.

DRAPPIER (R Myers) – raced greenly rounding the turn and hung out down the final straight and could not be ridden out as a result.

ARCTURUS (D Turner) – raced greenly three wide without cover throughout.

ASCENT FORTUNE (J Parkes) - shifted out making the crossing near the 900 metres awkwardly dictating LIANA out into the line of ARCTURUS which was forced over extra ground. A short distance further, LIANA and ARCTURUS bumped.

Race 5 POWERSHOP R65 1000M

AFFINEE (R Myers) – raced three wide without cover throughout. Disappointed. Connections advised the mare will not be persevered with as a racing proposition.

ELUSIVE JANE (R Goldsbury) – briefly held up passing the 350 metres. Steadied when improving onto heels approaching the 50 metres.

Race 6 MORE FM MAIDEN 1300M

ZIP ZAP (M Tanaka) – knuckled on jumping away losing ground.

FOXY POROTENE (J Parkes) – had to be straightened near the finish after running around a little under pressure.

RUSTY IN MELBOURNE (R Myers) – slow away.

SHRIMP COCKTAIL (R Goldsbury) – raced wide throughout.

CANDY BELT (D Turner) - had difficulty obtaining clear racing room early in the home straight.

SIAN (K Smith) – had to be angled wider on turning for home in order to continue to improve.

Race 7 4.36 B & B CONTRACTING MAIDEN 3YO

BELLADITA (L Hemi) – began awkwardly, lost ground and was then tightened when COLORADO PRINCE shifted out abruptly. Rider L Hemi reported that after settling back, the filly was not suited BY the slow early tempo. A post-race veterinary examination was clear.

SIGNORINA SVELTA (M Tanaka) - began awkwardly and shifted in abruptly.

AWESOME AL (D Bradley) - crowded shortly after the start and lost ground. Over-raced in the early and middle stages.

WORD SAVVY (T Johnson) – over-raced in the early and middle stages.

COLORADO PRINCE (H Tinsley) - raced ungenerously in the early stages. Raced three wide throughout.

Race 8 THE MARQUIS CARTERTON R65 1600M

FREELINKS (T Johnson) – was slow away. Held up by the weakening TICKET CLIPPER on the point of the turn.

BRONZEGATE (J Parkes) - had to steady near the 400 metres when DAVEY CROCKETT (H Tinsley) shifted out marginally to ensure clear running in the home straight. H Tinsley was advised to exercise more care.

Apprentice riders R Harris (TICKET CLIPPER) and S MacNab (CASEY MARIE) were questioned regarding the tactics employed on their respective mounts and shown footage of their rides in the presence of senior rider H Tinsley after both riders allowed their mounts to set a pace that neither horse was capable of maintaining throughout. Both riders acknowledged they had erred in their assessment of pace on this occasion and were advised that they are expected to exercise better judgement in future.

IRISH CHAT (L Hemi) - held up behind the weakening TICKET CLIPPER on the point of the turn.
