Race 1	HARRISONS CARPET ONE HANDICAP
EVA JENSINE (D Hirini) - raced ungenerously when being restrained early. Hung throughout	
DR WATSON (R Hannam) - held up passing the 600 metres	
Race 2	VISION ENHANCEMENT – AUDIO VISUAL SPECIALISTS MAIDEN
KINI MARIE (D Hirini) – was passed fit to start after undergoing a veterinary examination prior to the start when the mare charged the gates. Reared at start and settled back	
WENTWORTH (M Tanaka) – slow away	
DRAPPIER (A Chan) – raced wide without cover throughout	
MARGAUX GLAS (L Hemi) – raced in restricted room passing 600 metres	

Race 3	THE HANLEY FORMULA AUTUMN SPRINT QUALIFIER
<p>MANHATTEN STREET (J Riddell) – awkwardly away. When questioned into the disappointing run, J Riddell reported the gelding failed to respond when placed under pressure and he had no excuse. Connections were advised to monitor its progress over coming days and report any anomaly to the stewards.</p> <p>TRAVIMYFRIEND (H Tinsley) – raced three wide without cover throughout</p> <p>PADDY BOURKE (M Tanaka) – raced keenly in the early stages</p>	
Race 4	RAT TAT PLATE
<p>ROSETTA (H Andrew) – reared at start and settled back</p> <p>BATTLE TANK – Rider J Riddell was advised to exercise more care after shifting inwards near the 1100 metres when not fully clear of JESSIEGEE which had to be steadied. BATTLE TANK clipped a heel and blundered when attempting a run which did not eventuate near the 650 metres</p> <p>JESSIEGEE (R Hannam) – steadied near the 1100 metres. Shifted in under pressure over the final stages</p>	
Race 5	HAPPY 40TH JOSH DAWSON MAIDEN
<p>VOLACAPRI (R Goldsbury) – was slow away</p> <p>EXONERATE – when questioned into the disappointing run rider L Allpress reported the gelding raced greenly throughout and may not have been comfortable in the track conditions</p>	
Race 6	KILBIRNIE SPORTS HANDICAP
<p>VITALIA (R Hannam) – was awkward away bumping SANJARA. Raced three wide without cover throughout</p> <p>SANJARA (H Andrew) – awkwardly away bumping BIG DREAMER and VITALIA</p> <p>WIGGLE (S MacNab) – over-raced in the middle stages</p> <p>OUR BANDIT (L Allpress) – was held up briefly in the home straight having to be angled outwards to obtain clear running passing the 400 metres</p>	
Race 7	SPORTING TOURS MELBOURNE CUP TOUR HANDICAP
<p>RUSTY IN MELBOURNE = slow away</p> <p>GLENGOYNE (D Hirini) –slow away</p> <p>DAL SIR TEE (L Allpress) – raced keenly in the early and middle. Held up momentarily passing the 400 metres</p> <p>THE ORANGE PONY (R Goldsbury) – raced wide without cover throughout</p> <p>SHONALI (M Tanaka) – was held up for some distance passing the 400 metres having to be angled outwards across heels to obtain clear running passing the 150 metres</p>	
Race 8	REGISTER FOR PUNTERS CHALLENGE 27TH MAY HANDICAP
<p>HIGH DISTINCTION (D Danis) – began awkwardly bumping EXCEPTIONAL shortly after the start</p> <p>EXCEPTIONAL (A Chan) – bumped at the start. When questioned into the disappointing run, A Chan reported the filly was not entirely suited to the Slow 9 track conditions. A subsequent veterinary examination was clear.</p> <p>VERACIOUS (R Goldsbury) – began awkwardly and settled back</p> <p>CHESTER CARLSON (L Allpress) - raced ungenerously when being restrained in the early stages. Steadied near the 100 metres</p> <p>TALK THE TORQUE (D Hirini) - shifted in and away from ARYACRAZY near the 200 metres resulting in CHESTER CARLSON</p>	

having to be steadied near the 100 metres.
