Race 6 Courtesy Ford Manawatu Sires Produce Stakes (Group 1)

VALALIE (S Collett) – Trainer A Forsman advised that the filly underwent further veterinary examination in the days following this race which did not reveal any abnormality but would now be sent for a spell.

SWORD OF OSMAN (T Harris) – Trainer J Richards advised that they were satisfied with the recovery of the gelding following its performance in this race and it would now be sent for a spell.

Race 9 Kevin O'Connor & Associates Premier

KOKO BELLE (M Tanaka) – Trainer J Millar advised that the mare had undergone further treatment on return to her stable and would now be sent for a spell.

Race 7 Sherlock Contracting 1215

BELLE FASCINO (D Johnson) – Trainer S Marsh advised that he was satisfied with the recovery of the mare and it is his intention to continue on with its current preparation.

RACE COMMENTS:

Race 1 HOTEL COACHMAN HANDICAP (1400 metres)

BRING TO THE BLOCK (C Johnson) – Slow away, inclined to over-race in the middle stages.

DISTURBANCE (C-M Waddell) – Over-raced in the early stages.

THE BANDITO (C Lammas) – Lay out rounding the bend, continued to lay out under pressure in the straight.

Race 2 CREATIVE CATERING 3YO MAIDEN (1200 metres)

ROCK 'N' AFFAIR (S McKay) – Passed fit to run following a veterinary inspection behind the barriers after making contact with a gate leaving the enclosure, slow away.

DELAROSA (C Lammas) – Over-raced when being restrained in the early to middle stages.

BIDE A WEE (C-M Waddell) - Hung outwards rounding the turn and on entering the home straight was dictated wider when MAKOURA LODGE (R Myers) shifted ground. R Myers was advised to exercise greater care.

Race 3 TRINA SHERIDAN @ LJ HOOKER HANDICAP (1550 metres)

LIBRETTI (D Johnson) – Slow away (4L). When questioned regarding performance rider advised that after missing the start the mare had raced flat and in her opinion may be feeling the effects of recent racing. A post-race veterinary examination did not reveal any significant abnormality.

ROLL THE GOLD (R Myers) –Raced three wide without cover, lay in under pressure in the final straight

TAVIGARDE (C Johnson) – Raced keenly in the early stages.

ANIMATOR (C Dell) - Held up rounding the bend passing the 500 metres, inconvenienced 175 metres when TAVIGARDE shifted outwards, lay in under pressure in the final straight.

Race 4 THE HANLEY FORMULA AUTUMN CHAMPIONSHIP QUALIFIER (1200 metres)

HUGO THE BOSS (C Lammas) – Reared in the barriers after becoming fractious and was removed to undergo a veterinary examination before being declared fit to run, commenced to over-race when being restrained passing the 1000 metres, continuing to do so through the middle stages, when questioned regarding performance rider was unable to offer any tangible excuse.

VATICAN NEWS (T Allan) – Over-raced in the middle stages.

DANMULAN (D Bradley) – Raced three wide without cover.

RUFUS RUFFCUT (J Parkes) – Held up rounding the final turn, continuing to have some difficulty obtaining clear running until near the 100 metres.

Race 5 SOUTH STREET WEST MOTEL HANDICAP (1200 metres)

NATIONAL ASSET (D Hirini) - Jumped away awkwardly and shifted inwards crowding CASAQUINMAN onto DEVIL MAY CARE, which were both hampered losing ground, raced wide without cover.

CASAQUINMAN (M McNelis) – Hampered start, losing ground, raced very wide rounding the bend.

DEVIL MAY CARE (D Johnson) – Hampered start, losing ground.

JUST YOU (R Hannam) – Crowded leaving the barriers having to be steadied.

MISS CONTESSA (S Collett) - Held up for a distance passing the 200 metres.

SOPHIA MAGIA (R Myers) – Had to be angled outwards across heels to obtain clear running near the 200 metres.

BEAUDEN (C Johnson) – Raced keenly in the middle stages.

PEP TORQUE (L Hemi) – Lost the right hind plate during the running.

Race 6 LAWNMASTER HANDICAP (1400 metres)

MASTER PLATINUM (R Hannam) - Slow away.

PERFECT SHOCK (C Lammas) - Jumped away awkwardly before being further hampered.

ALLURE (J Bayliss) – Hampered leaving the barriers when CHOICE ATTITUDE was taken inwards by REBEL ROSE which jumped away awkwardly.

CHOICE ATTITUDE (C O'Beirne) – Taken inwards at start. Held up near the 100 metres having to shift outwards across the heels of INCANTATION to obtain clear running.

REBEL ROSE (J Fawcett) – Jumped away awkwardly.

LISBETH (S Collett) – Jumped away awkwardly, losing ground, went amiss when racing free of interference rounding the turn passing the 400 metres being pulled up by its rider, having to be humanely euthanised as the filly had fractured the fetlock in left hind leg.

REMINGTON (T Newman) – Lay out under pressure in the final straight.

Race 7 LJ HOOKER MANAWATU BREEDERS (2000 metres)

STROLLING VAGABOND (M Tanaka) – Restrained when jumping away from the outside barrier. Saddle slipped forward going into the back straight.

SLIMLINE (D Bradley) – Over-raced when being steadied passing the 1800 metres.

ALL IN VOGUE (C Lammas) - Shifted outwards to obtain clear running near the 150 metres dictating MISSY MOO a little wider on the track.

MISSY MOO (J Parkes) - Dictated wider 150 metres.

DONIZETTI (D Johnson) - Advised her instructions were to ride the mare back in the field but never travelled particularly well and did not quicken once placed under pressure, with her opinion being that DONIZETTI may have been feeling the effects of recent racing.

ANGEL IN BLUEJEANS (S McKay) – Was not persevered with in the final straight with the rider advising that that mare had felt indifferent in its action. A post-race veterinary inspection revealed a slow post-race recovery.

CALLIGRAPHY (S Weatherley) – When questioned regarding performance rider advised, with the mare having its first

start beyond 1600 metres he had been advised to rider it back with cover but once placed under pressure had failed to quicken to any degree, being disappointing with no tangible excuse offered other than possibly being suited by some further easing of the ground. A post-race veterinary inspection did not reveal any obvious abnormality.

PORCELAIN PRINCESS (R Myers) – When questioned regarding performance rider was unable to offer any tangible excuse other than the mare may be feeling the effects of recent racing.

CHINA STAR (R Hannam) - When questioned regarding improved performance trainer advised the mare had derived benefit from its recent run over 1600 metres and a subsequent trial appreciating the step up in distance today.

Race 8 KAMADA PARK HANDICAP (2100 metres)

SO IT WAS (A Shin) – Restrained to the rear after jumping from the outside barrier.

WORD SAVVY (J Parkes) - Over-raced when being restrained in the early stages.

THE COSSACK (C Lammas) – Commenced to over-race passing the 1800 metres shifting outwards to avoid heels then racing three wide without cover.

TERRACOTTA WARRIOR (S McKay) – Commenced to over-race when the pace steadied near the 1600 metres then being allowed to improve forward to lead near the 1200 metres.

TIPPING POINT (R Myers) – Held up rounding the final turn, when questioned regarding performance rider advised that after being held up at a vital stage of the race the mare had found the line well.
