RACE COMMENTS:

Race 1	HIRE ARAWA PARK FUNCTION ROOMS 1950
REFLECTION (M Coleman) – Hampered leaving the barriers.	
AKABA (C Lammas) – Raced in restricted room soon after leaving the barriers.	
SPECIAL LIGHT (J Waddell) – Raced wide in the early stages.	
MIGHTY COLOMBO (A Calder) – Raced three wide without cover throughout.	

INVIGORATE (R Elliot) – Held up rounding the final bend before shifting in approaching the 200 metres into a marginal run to obtain clear running.

FINE AND DANDEE (L Satherley) – Held up until near the 50 metres.

BECAUSE (T Yanagida) – Had difficulty obtaining clear running for the majority of the final straight, then had to be steadied after improving on to heels near the 100 metres.

FUTURE PATCH (J Bayliss) – Underwent a post-race veterinary examination after the gelding was observed to have blood present in both nostrils which deemed FUTURE PATCH to be a bleeder. The connections were advised that FUTURE PATCH is subject to a 3 month stand down from racing, 2 month stand down from training and FUTURE PATCH would require a veterinary clearance prior to racing next. Co-trainer A Scott advised that he would give consideration to retiring the gelding.

C Lammas (AKABA) – Reminded of his obligations that he must ride his mounts out to the end of a race when circumstances permit him to do so with C Lammas advising his mount was tiring and he had become awkwardly placed on the heels of FINE AND DANDEE which shifted out over the concluding stages.

Race 2	VAN DYKS FURNISHERS 1230
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PAUL'S SUPER ARIKI (A Calder) – Crowded and hampered leaving the barriers.

SPIRIT OF GALWAY (M Cameron) – Began awkwardly then crowded and hampered losing ground. Lost the near front plate during the running.

RAZ (J Waddell) – Began awkwardly making contact and then steadied when crowded. Lay in when placed under pressure in the final straight, then had to be steadied after improving on to the heels of SALT BAY near the 50 metres.

TARWYN (T Harris) – Began awkwardly.

Race 3	MILLS REEF WINERY 1100
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LISMORE DIAMOND (D Mansour) – Began awkwardly and then crowded and hampered losing ground.

IRON EAGLE (S McKay) – Crowded and checked approaching the 1000 metres.

P Gallagher (TOUGH KID) – Admitted a breach of careless riding in that he permitted his mount to shift in approaching the 1000 metres when insufficiently clear of IRON EAGLE which was crowded and checked, with the Judicial Committee suspending his licence to ride in races from the conclusion of racing on 23 January up to and including racing on 30 January, 5 national riding days.

TOUGH KID (P Gallagher) – When questioned regarding performance rider advised that in his opinion the gelding was feeling the effects of recent racing. Lost the off hind plate during the running. The connections advised the gelding suffered minor lacerations to the off hind leg.

SPARKLING LASS (L Satherley) – Steadied when placed in restricted room near the 850 metres, then made the bend awkwardly shifting wider on the track.

HIRAETH (J Bayliss) – Raced in restricted room passing the 800 metres to the inside of TOUGH KID which shifted in when not fully clear. Rider P Gallagher was advised to exercise care.

ARRIVO (T Newman) – Lost the left front plate during the running.

Race 4	ISCL 1230
<p>PERSWAYED (C Lammas) – Began awkwardly losing ground. Raced keenly in the early to middle stages. When questioned regarding the performance rider C Lammas advised Stewards that the gelding would derive some benefit from today's run and would be benefitted by a step up in distance.</p> <p>AUTUMN WILD (T Yanagida) – Raced ungenerously when being restrained in the early stages.</p>	
Race 5	RYDGES HOTEL ROTORUA 1400
<p>BRIDAL VEIL (J Bayliss) – When questioned regarding the performance rider J Bayliss advised Stewards that in his opinion the mare would be better suited to firmer track conditions.</p> <p>ENDEAN EXPRESS (R Elliot) – Lost the near front plate during the running.</p>	
Race 6	CAMPBELL INFRASTRUCTURE 1950
<p>ELEGANT D'ORO (J Waddell) – Began awkwardly losing ground.</p> <p>INITIATIVE (R Elliot) – Began awkwardly.</p> <p>GENERAL SHERMAN (T Harris) – Began awkwardly then hampered shortly after. Had difficulty obtaining clear running early in the final straight.</p> <p>HEAVENLY GOLD (A Jones) – Raced ungenerously when being restrained in the early stages.</p> <p>NEXT UP (G Cooksley) – Forced wider early in the final straight by SUNNY ROSE which shifted out to obtain clear running. NEXT UP then lay in when placed under pressure forcing SUNNY ROSE inwards.</p> <p>SUNNY ROSE (A Calder) – Held up rounding the final bend, then shifted out to obtain clear running entering the final straight making contact with GENERAL SHERMAN which was forced wider. SUNNY ROSE was then forced inwards slightly in the final straight over the concluding stages by NEXT UP which lay in.</p> <p>The connections of the second placed runner SUNNY ROSE viewed Stewards footage before electing not to proceed with a protest.</p>	
Race 7	NZB INSURANCE PEARL SERIES RACE
<p>KINSHASA (S Collett) – Slow to begin.</p> <p>DANELYN (S McKay) – Slow to begin.</p> <p>CHEERS (S Spratt) – Raced ungenerously for a distance in the early to middle stages.</p> <p>POWER OF STRENGTH (R Elliot) – Briefly crowded passing the 150 metres to the inside of IT'S DOABLE (D Mansour) which shifted away from KINSHASA. Rider D Mansour was advised to exercise care in similar circumstances.</p> <p>NICOLE ASHLEY (T Yanagida) – The saddle shifted forward shortly after the start placing the rider at a disadvantage for the remainder of the race. Received veterinary attention post-race for a laceration to the right eye lid.</p>	
Race 8	ENJOY TROTting HERE 27 JANUARY 1400
<p>GALLAGHER (S McKay) – Slow to begin.</p> <p>KIWI ACE (J Waddell) – Began awkwardly. Raced three wide without cover throughout.</p>	

HARBOURSIDE (T Harris) – Began awkwardly and then was obliged to race wide in the early stages before being forced wide passing the 1000 metres by LEONARDO which was dictated outwards by KANDARI which had shifted out off heels when racing fiercely. HARBOURSIDE was then further steadied. Lost the near hind plate during the running.

KANDARI (M Cameron) – Raced fiercely passing the 1000 metres shifting out off heels.

LEONARDO (T Yanagida) – Hampered when forced wide 1000 metres. Held up rounding the final bend before shifting out to obtain clear running early in the final straight.

RITA AURA (S Spratt) – Made the bend awkwardly approaching the 800 metres.

MAN POWER (D Hain) – Steadied for a distance passing the 900 metres when awkwardly placed on heels.

CAUGHT THE EYE (A Calder) – Raced keenly in the early and middle stages.

MISS ANONYMOUS (J Bayliss) – When questioned regarding the performance rider advised that the mare had failed to handle today's track conditions. Underwent a post-race veterinary examination which revealed the mare to be suffering from mild shin soreness.
