RACE COMMENTS:

OSTREIDAE (A Calder) – Began awkwardly losing ground.

SCIACCA (T Harris) – Began awkwardly. Lay out throughout the run home.

RUSSIAN ROULETTE (A Jones) — Had to be steadied passing the 2100 metres when JUNE ROSE (R Elliot) improved forward to lead when only marginally clear. R Elliot was advised to exercise greater care.

THOUSAND STARS (E McCall) – Raced wide before improving to the lead passing the 1400 metres. When asked for a comment on the improved performance of the filly trainer D Guy advised that in her opinion the extra distance of today's

race was more suitable to the filly.

R James and R Wellwood (CORNISH POINT) – Trainer R Wellwood sought to scratch the filly after he became aware that a substance had been mistakenly administered to CORNISH POINT on race morning, with the Stewards ordering the scratching of the filly at 12.14 pm. Trainers R James and R Wellwood admitted a resultant breach of Rule 534(2)(a) and a fine of \$600 was imposed by the Judicial Committee.

Race 2 THE BGP FOUNDATION BEAT THE CLOCK AT TE AROHA 1600

KOMRAD (R Elliot) – Slow to begin.

FOODIE KING (J Bayliss) – Slow to begin. Hampered at 200 metres.

SPIRITED (M McNab) – Slow to begin. Improved into run at 200 metres being crowded, buffeted and badly unbalanced clipping a heel and blundering losing all momentum.

SIGNOR DAL (C Dell) – Crowded and had to be restrained passing the 1300 metres. Continued to over-race through the middle stages getting its head up on a number of occasions. Shifted out and away from GOLDCHI passing the 200 metres crowding outside runners.

MIDNIGHT DUKE (T Thornton) – Crowded and had to be restrained passing the 1300 metres. Crowded, buffeted and badly unbalanced at 200 metres.

A Goindasamy (GOLDCHI) – Issued with a warning for allowing his mount to shift in when only marginally clear of SIGNOR DAL and MIDNIGHT DUKE which both had to steady passing the 1300 metres .

LINCOLN KING (T Harris) – Raced wide without cover through the early stages. Inconvenienced at 200 metres.

HOLY LOCH (D Mansour) – Raced wide without cover throughout.

GOLDCHI (A Goindasamy) – Lay out passing the 200 metres having to be straightened with SIGNOR DAL then shifting away from that runner simultaneously as GOLDEN AGE improved into a marginal run to the outside of SIGNOR DAL and was then crowded to the inside of MIDNIGHT DUKE with SPIRITED also improving into a marginal run to the inside of INTRIGUE with the outward movement causing GOLDEN AGE, MIDNIGHT DUKE and SPIRITED to all be crowded and badly unbalanced losing ground. INTRIGUE was also unbalanced in this incident with FOODIE KING also being hampered as a consequence. Steward's interviewed all riders involved and after viewing replays no one rider could be held accountable and took the matter no further.

GOLDEN AGE (O Bosson) – Improved into a marginal run passing the 200 metres and was crowded buffeted and badly unbalanced.

INTRIGUE (L Innes) – Contacted from the inside near the 200 metres being briefly unbalanced. When questioned into the apparent improved performance rider advised that the step-up to 1600 metres today had been more to the filly's liking.

Race 3 NZB INSURANCE PEARL SERIES RACE

IRIDESSA (J Bayliss) – Began awkwardly losing ground.

BABICHE (A Calder) – Over-raced in the early stages. Had some difficulty obtaining clear running throughout the early and middle part of the run home.

TORQUE STRAIGHT (S Collett) – Lay out rounding the bend near the 600 metres crowding MAGNOLIA LANE which had to steady.

MAGNOLIA LANE (S McKay) – Crowded and had to steady when placed in restricted room between TORQUE STRAIGHT which was laying out and LENA which stepped in on the point of the turn.

LENA (A Goindasamy) – Raced three wide without cover throughout.

SAVASTEP (L Satherley) – Held up for clear racing room until near the 150 metres.

LOWRIDER (C Dell) – Underwent a post-race veterinary examination which revealed the mare to be a bleeder. The connections were advised that the mare would now be subject to a three month stand down from racing and a two month stand down from training. Also a veterinary clearance would be required prior to trialing or racing next.

Race 4 SIR SLICK WINNERS CIRCLE 1600

BINGWA (D Mansour) - Slow to begin.

GEHRIG (V Colgan) – Over-raced in the early and middle stages.

SAHAR (L Innes) – Placed in restricted room having to steady passing the 1200 metres.

T Harris (DEELS DONE) – Issued with a warning for allowing his mount to shift in when only marginally clear of SAHAR passing the 1200 metres.

DEELS DONE (T Harris) – When questioned regarding performance rider T Harris advised that the gelding had got its tongue over the bit early in the run and had been disappointing.

Race 5 NZB INSURANCE PEARL SERIES RACE

FLOMILINE (R Elliot) – Began awkwardly. When spoken to regarding performance rider advised that the filly had never let down when placed under pressure with the Stewards ordering a post-race veterinary examination which did not reveal any abnormality.

ELUSIVE METEOR (A Goindasamy) – Raced keenly in the early stages.

ROBUSTO (T Harris) – Held up early in the run home having to shift ground outwards.

BET SHE IS (S Spratt) – Crowded in the shadows of the post and had to steady.

Race 6 COMAG LTD 1400

PRINCE ALBERT (M McNab) — Underwent a pre-race veterinary examination at the barriers and was late scratched at 3.20 pm on veterinary advice. Connections were advised the colt would need a veterinary clearance prior to racing next.

VEDO ROSSO (G Cooksley) – Began awkwardly losing ground. Placed in restricted room when inside runners shifted out under pressure passing the 150 metres.

NOTHINBRAXLYKAHART (V Colgan) – Crowded and had to steady shortly after the start.

S Collett (MISS ANONYMOUS) – Issued with a warning after allowing her mount to shift in when insufficiently clear of NOTHINBRAXLYKAHART which was crowded and had to be restrained shortly after the start.

JUST A PHOEBE (R Norvall) – Raced wide without cover throughout.

SCHERZO (O Bosson) – Made the bend by the 750 metres awkwardly shifting wider on the track becoming awkwardly placed on heels and having to be restrained.

MIGHTY ASLAN (S Spratt) – Lay outwards passing the 200 metres and had to be straightened.

Race 7 ECOLAB LTD 1200

STELLA NOIRE (L Innes) – Slow to begin. Held up rounding the final bend and early in the run home.

TUSCAN WHISTLER (T Harris) – Restrained to the rear on jumping away. Lay in early in the run home. Rider T Harris lost the use of his inside stirrup iron passing the 200 metres becoming unbalanced and was dislodged. T Harris was attended to by the St John's paramedics and was stood down from his remaining ride, with T Harris being transferred to hospital for further assessment. Mr Harris was advised he will need a medical clearance prior to riding next.

Race 8 FIBER FRESH BREEDERS STAKES RACEDAY 6 APRIL

There was a delay to the running of this race due to ambulance personnel attending to the injured rider from the previous race.

KATE LOUISE (L Satherley) – Crowded shortly after the start having to be steadied.

BEAUTY STAR (L Innes) – Raced wide throughout.

MEANT TO BE (C Lammas) – Tailed the field throughout with the rider advising the gelding would be better suited to races with more distance.
