<p><u>Auckland Racing Club – Wednesday 26 December 2018</u> Race 9 - Cambridge Stud Zabeel Classic (2000 metres) Group 1 NICOLETTA (J Waddell) – Trainer A Forsman advised that he was satisfied with the recovery of the mare, adding it is their intention to freshen NICOLETTA prior to racing next.</p> <p><u>Auckland Racing Club – Wednesday 26 December 2018</u> Race 10 – Otakiri Reserve 1600 N Hanley & K Whiting – At an adjourned hearing held at Racing Tauranga's meeting today the training partnership admitted a breach of Rule 534(1) in that they failed to scratch the horse EL COOLIO by the required time, being fined the sum of \$150 by the Judicial Committee.</p>

BATTLE SKY (T Thornton) – Trainer M Fraser-Campin advised Stewards that he was satisfied with the recovery of the gelding and it is his intention to continue on with its current preparation.

Race 4 - THE MEAT CO. MATAMATA 1400

MARIJA (C Lammas) – Trainer A Scott advised Stewards that in his opinion the mare had felt the effects of the race and had taken some time to recover, adding that MARIJA will now be freshened prior to racing next.

RACE COMMENTS:

Race 1 | **INTERISLANDER SUMMER FESTIVAL 1300**

TONADILLAS (M Cameron) – Slow to begin. Commenced to give ground passing the 600 metres. When questioned rider M Cameron advised that the gelding had raced greenly, changing stride on numerous occasions. Underwent a post-race veterinary examination which did not reveal any obvious abnormality. Co-trainer Mr S Ramsay advised that it was his intention to trial the horse prior to racing next, further advising that the gelding would be fully vetted on return to his stable, and he may give consideration to sending it for a spell.

AERO DE PARIS (C Lammas) – Crowded shortly after the start having to be steadied. Raced keenly in the middle stages. Became awkwardly placed on heels over the concluding stages.

KAILANI SUNSET (S Spratt) – Raced wide without cover throughout. Lay out rounding the final bend shifting wider. When questioned regarding performance S Spratt advised the filly may prefer some easing of the ground.

DUDEWITHATTITUDE (T Thornton) – Held up in the final straight having to be restrained off heels passing the 200 metres, gaining clear running inside the final 150 metres.

Race 2 | **GARTSHORE CONSTRUCTION 1600**

NINKASI (L Innes) – Slow to begin. Held up entering the final straight. Unable to obtain clear running until inside the final 200 metres.

TINTERO (M Cameron) – Began awkwardly, then commenced to race ungenerously when being restrained in the early stages.

SASERELLO (R Elliot) – Crowded shortly after the start having to be steadied. Improved on to heels over the concluding stages.

SOUTHERN QUEEN (S Rusof) – Crowded and checked losing ground approaching the 1400 metres when SOCKATASH lay in despite the efforts of its rider. Held up passing the 400 metres for a distance, then continued to have difficulty obtaining clear running until near the 250 metres. Shifted out under pressure over the final 100 metres when racing greenly.

MOIRAS TOWN (R Smyth) – Attempted to improve into a marginal run passing the 350 metres making brief contact with SOCKATASH which then lay in crowding MOIRAS TOWN which was then held up for a distance. Contributing was movement from DISPATCHED which lay out when entering the final straight.

FUTURE PATCH (J Riddell) – Shifted out to obtain clear running passing the 400 metres forcing MAV wider on the track.

MAV (S Collett) – Raced three wide without cover throughout.

GUILLOCHARM (S Spratt) – Held up passing the 400 metres for a distance.

LUCKYISMYNAME (B Grylls) – Rider B Grylls reported that the gelding had hung throughout and proved difficult to ride.

Race 3 | **REAL CHARTERED ACCOUNTANTS 2100**

EXPRESS CALL (R Elliot) – Lay out rounding the final bend shifting wider. When questioned regarding performance apprentice rider R Elliot could offer no excuses.

Race 4 | **STE INDUSTRIAL ELECTRICAL 2100**

M Moroney & P Gerard (PRESS MY BUTTONS) – The training partnership of M Moroney and P Gerard was fined \$100 for late declaration of rider for PRESS MY BUTTONS.

WHEAO (J Riddell) – Commenced to buck shortly after leaving the barriers and was retired from the race. Co-trainer M Carter was advised that the gelding must trial to the satisfaction of a Stipendiary Steward prior to racing again.

INVIGORATE (R Elliot) – Raced ungenerously when being restrained near the 1800 metres making the first bend awkwardly and was further hampered when laying out across heels passing the 1500 metres. Became awkwardly placed on the heels of DELLE QUARTZA when attempting to improve to that runner's outside passing the 300 metres when DELLE QUARTZA (S Rusof) shifted out. INVIGORATE was then held up for a distance. S Rusof was advised to exercise greater care in similar circumstances.

IMPECCABLE CHOICE (T Harris) – Commenced to over-race passing the 1700 metres making the bend awkwardly inconveniencing GLOBAL DIAMOND.

RUSALKA (S Spratt) – Commenced to race ungenerously passing the 1700 metres making the bend awkwardly.

HUCKLEBERRY HUSSIE (C Lammas) – Raced wide in the early stages.

SPECTRA (M Cameron) – Raced wide in the early stages.

GLOBAL DIAMOND (T Thornton) – Crowded when weakening approaching the 400 metres.

J Bayliss MONT VENTOUX – Was reminded of his obligations with regard to whip use with raising his arm above his shoulder.

Race 5 | **NEW WORLD SUMMER CUP 1400**

MATO GROSSO (C Lammas) – Lost the right front plate during the running.

Race 6 | **BULK LINES LIMITED 1600**

EL COOLIO (D Danis) – Crowded shortly after the start having to be steadied.

BET SHE IS (S Collett) – Crowded passing the 1300 metres and steadied when racing in restricted room to the inside of MADAM WOO which became awkwardly placed inside the heels of SHERIFFS DAUGHTER (T Thornton) which shifted in when not fully clear. Rider T Thornton was advised that she must exercise greater care in similar circumstances. When questioned regarding performance rider S Collett advised that the mare may be feeling the effects of recent racing. A post-race veterinary examination did not reveal any abnormality.

ARTISTE (T Yanagida) – Shifted out to obtain clear running passing the 350 metres inconveniencing SHERIFFS DAUGHTER which became briefly unbalanced.

SHERIFFS DAUGHTER (T Thornton) – Inconvenienced 350 metres.

<p>STAND TALL (J Bayliss) – Held up rounding the bend having to shift out early in the final straight to obtain clear running.</p> <p>AILEEN GRACE (M Cameron) – Lost the left hind plate during the running.</p> <p>RUBY BLOOM (J Riddell) – Lost the right front plate returning to the enclosure.</p> <p>SO WICKED (S Collett) – When questioned regarding performance both the rider and trainer advised that the mare had found today’s track conditions too firm and requires rain affected conditions to produce its best.</p>	
Race 8	ROB PINNY REALTY 1400
<p>JUNE ROSE (C Lammas) – Began awkwardly losing ground.</p> <p>BINGWA (S Rusof) – Slow to begin.</p> <p>MAGDALA (M Coleman) – Began awkwardly. Hung out making the final bend. When questioned regarding performance M Coleman advised that the filly had raced greenly throughout.</p> <p>VEDO ROSSO (S Spratt) – Had to change ground approaching the 300 metres to obtain clear running.</p> <p>BLUSHING HEIGHTS (T Yanagida) – Shifted in abruptly entering the final straight making contact with the running rail, and again made contact with the running rail approaching the 100 metres.</p> <p>ORATIA (M Cameron) – When questioned regarding performance rider M Cameron advised that the filly had raced greenly and would improve with today’s experience.</p> <p>T Yanagida (BLUSHING HEIGHTS) – Was questioned after returning to scale 0.4 kg below the weight in which he had weighed out, with apprentice T Yanagida explaining that he had used the bathroom prior to the race.</p>	
Race 9	NEW WORLD MOUNT MAUNGANUI 1400
<p>UNNAMEABLE (T Thornton) – Began awkwardly losing ground.</p> <p>ROCKING ALONG (J Bayliss) – Began awkwardly shifting out making firm contact with BIRDIE BLITZ. Raced three wide without cover. Underwent a post-race veterinary examination which did not reveal any abnormality. Connections advised they would be giving consideration to gelding ROCKING ALONG.</p> <p>NICOLE ASHLEY (M Cameron) – Began awkwardly losing ground, then crowded shortly after having to be steadied.</p> <p>HOLY LOCH (D Danis) – Began awkwardly.</p> <p>QWERTY (S Spratt) – Raced in restricted room for a distance passing the 300 metres.</p> <p>RIPPA EAGLE (M McNab) – Lay out when placed under pressure in the final straight.</p>
