Races were delayed while the running rail was shifted inwards 2 metres with Race 2 run at 1.26 pm, Race 3 run at 1.56 pm, Races 4 through to 6 put back one race and Race 7 run at 4.08pm.

Race 4 TOMOS ALUMINIUM SERVICES 1200

TED CAN TOO (R Hannam) – Trainer Mr. P Didham reported to Stewards TED CAN TOO underwent a veterinary examination on Friday 3 June which included an endoscopic examination and blood tests, with results showing no abnormalities with the endoscopic examination, however, blood tests confirmed the gelding to have a virus. P Didham further advised TED CAN TOO has now been placed on four days' worth of treatment and he will also continue on with the gelding's current preparation.

CHICA BONITA (M McNab) – Trainer Mr. F Auret advised Stewards although satisfied with the post-race condition of CHICA BONITA puts the disappointing performance down to the mare being unsuited to the Heavy 10 track conditions. F Auret further advised it is his intention to continue on with the mare's current preparation.

CURRENT SURGE (K Hannan) – Trainer A Forsman advised Stewards he was satisfied with the post-race condition of the gelding, and it is his intention to continue on with CURRENT SURGE'S preparation with A Forsman further advising he may consider a step up in distance for the gelding.

RACE COMMENTS

Race 1 THE BOLD ONE @ GRANGEWILLIAM STUD MDN 1600M

AULD JOCK (C Jones) - Slow to begin.

WOODSIDE (K Asano) – Slow to begin.

SPANISH HARLEM (J Mudhoo) – Slow to begin.

DUTCH DAME (T Taiaroa) – Began awkwardly losing ground. Raced wide without cover throughout.

NINE REALMS (B Rogerson) – Restrained behind runners to obtain cover shortly after the start.

VALHALLA RISING (F Lazet) – Raced three wide without cover throughout.

Race 2 ZED @ GRANGEWILLIAM STUD 1600

WAIAGARA (H Schofer) - Slow to begin.

MASSO (A Mudhoo) – Contacted then hampered losing ground.

BLACKWOOD STAR (L Douglas) – Slow to begin.

FRANKENSTEIN (J Kamaruddin) – Commenced to give ground near the 700 metres and was not persevered with in the home straight finishing a distant last. When questioned regarding performance the rider advised the gelding was making abnormal breathing noises and felt indifferent in its action. Underwent a post race veterinary examination which revealed a slow recovery rate.

Race 3 DERRYN @ GRANGEWILLIAM STUD 3YO 1400

WHEELITIN (A Mudhoo) – Began awkwardly losing ground.

MONSWEY (B Rogerson) – Commenced to over race for a distance near the 1200 metres. Was not persevered with in the home straight. When questioned, the rider advised the gelding had raced greenly throughout and did not benefit from the existing track conditions.

BLUE RATA BOLDNESS (T Taiaroa) – Finished some distance back. When questioned regarding the performance rider advised the gelding may have held its breath and was not suited to the heavy 10 track conditions.

Following the running of race 3 which was run in a heavy downpour, apprentice riders approached Stewards on weighing in, expressing concern with kick-back in the very loose footing making visibility an issue. A meeting was convened with riders, club officials and the RIB with the remaining races being abandoned due to safety issues.
